ORDINANCE NO. 2022-02 INTRODUCED BY: Mayor Bodnar

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING MAYFIELD VILLAGE CODIFIED ORDINANCE CHAPTER 147 COMMISSION ON AGING

WHEREAS, in 1982, Mayfield Village Council initially adopted Chapter 147 of the Codified Ordinances establishing the Commission on Aging; and

WHEREAS, upon a recent review of the Chapter certain updates were found necessary; and

WHEREAS, Mayfield Village Council deems it in the best interest and for the health, safety and welfare of Mayfield Village and its residents to amend Chapter 147 of the Codified Ordinances.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of Mayfield Village, Cuyahoga County, State of Ohio that:

- <u>SECTION 1</u>. Chapter 147 of the Village's Codified Ordinances is amended to read as fully set forth in Exhibit "A" which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- <u>SECTION 2</u>. Any sections of the Codified Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby and herein repealed and amended accordingly. All other provisions of the Village Codified Ordinances not inconsistent herewith shall remain in full force and effect.
- <u>SECTION 3</u>. The Clerk of Council is authorized and directed to forward a certified copy of this Ordinance to the Codifier of Mayfield Village.
- SECTION 4. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Ordinance have been taken at open meetings of this Council and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements, including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect after adoption and at the earliest time allowed by law.

147.01 CREATION.

There is hereby established a Commission on Aging which shall be constituted and have such powers and duties as may be prescribed from time-to-time by the Mayor and Council. (Ord. 82-30. Passed 5-3-82.)

147.02 MEMBERSHIP, TERM AND VACANCY.

- (a) Membership. The Commission on Aging shall consist of <u>five seven voting</u> members who shall be appointed as follows:
- (1) The Mayor shall appoint one resident of the Municipality who shall be sixty years of age or older and who shall be a voting member of the Commission;
- (2) Council, by majority vote, shall appoint four residents of the Municipality who shall be sixty years of age or older, all of whom shall be voting members of the Commission;
- (3) (EDITOR'S NOTE: This subsection was repealed by Ordinance 87-11, passed May 18, 1987.)
- (4) The Council President shall appoint one member of Council to serve as a nonvoting member of the Commission. Age shall not be a factor in this appointment.
 - (b) Term.
- (1) The initial appointment by the Mayor and two of the initial appointments by Council shall serve terms expiring December 31, 1983. The other two appointments by Council shall serve terms expiring December 31, 1984. All subsequent appointments shall be for terms of two years.

- (2) The initial appointment of a Coordinator by Council shall serve a term expiring December 31, 1983. All subsequent appointments of a Coordinator shall be for a term of two years.
- (3) The initial appointment of a Council member by the Council President to serve on the Commission shall be for a term expiring December 31, 1983. All subsequent appointments of a Council member to the Commission on Aging shall be for a term of one year.

147.03 COMPENSATION.

All members of the Commission on Aging shall serve without compensation. (Ord. 82-30. Passed 5-3-82.)

147.04 POWERS AND DUTIES.

The Commission on Aging shall adopt its own rules and regulations to govern its activities. In addition, the Commission shall elect one of its voting members as Chairman.

The Commission shall serve in an advisory capacity to the Administration and Council on all matters relating to aging and to recommend programs for the aging citizens of the Municipality and the means of implementing such programs. The Commission may consider and make recommendations in the following areas of concern relating to the problems of aging, without limitation:

- (a) Senior Information and Education
- (b) Assistance and Services Available to Seniors
- (c) Health, Wellness and Nutrition
- (d) Recreational Programs, Special Events and Activities
- (e) Transportation Assistance
 - (a) Referral Services or Senior Information and Service Center On:
- (1) Job placement/skills bank.
- (2) Medicare-Social Security Information.
- (3) Emergency services.
- (4) Telephone assurance.
- -(b) -- Health:
- (1) Increased or changing of existing services.
- (2) Voluntary service programs with medical school, etc.
- (3) Preventive health program.
- (c) Leisure Time Activities as follows:
- (1) Trips.

(2) Classes.
(3) Exercise programs.
(4) Social involvement to provide services.
(5) Programs such as dances, plays, movies, lectures, etc.
(6) Recreation.
(7) Current events in the Municipality.
(d) Transportation:
(1) Define needs (questionnaire).
(2) Coordinating available services.
(e) Nutrition:
(1) Food stamp program.
(2) Hot food (lunches, meals on wheels).

147.05 MEETINGS.

— (3) Nutrition education. (Ord. 82-30. Passed 5-3-82.)

The Commission on Aging shall select meeting dates which are agreeable to a majority of the members of the Commission. The Commission shall meet no less than six times per year with additional meetings as required. A quorum of three voting members shall be present to conduct the business of any meeting. A majority of the voting members appointed to the Commission shall be necessary in order to carry the vote on any issue before the Commission. (Ord. 84-20. Passed 5-21-84.)

147.06 FUNDING.

The Commission on Aging shall be appropriated such funds for its operations as shall be determined from time-to-time by Council, such funds to be used for the benefit of the Municipality's senior citizens in accordance with applicable provisions of Ohio law concerning such expenditures.

(Ord. 82-30. Passed 5-3-82.)

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- (3) The Council President shall appoint one member of Council to serve as a nonvoting member of the Commission. Age shall not be a factor in this appointment.
- (b) Term.
 - (1) All appointments shall be for terms of two years.
- (2) All Council member appointments to the Commission on Aging shall be for a term of one year.

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
