Council President Schutt replied, no, we are not. Basically it was brought to our attention. The intent of the Resolution is to bring awareness and advocacy around SUDEP and to proclaim October 25th as SUDEP Awareness Day. The initiative was encouraged from the Epilepsy Association of Cleveland to bring more awareness around the community.

Mrs. Betsa asked, if I may add to the discussion?

Council President Schutt stated, sure.

Mrs. Betsa stated, I did a little bit of research on SUDEP. The Ohio General Assembly passed Brenna's Law in honor of the late Brenna Brossard, daughter of Council President Brossard of North Olmsted who passed away from SUDEP. Council President Brossard has requested that Council from all municipalities in the State of Ohio consider passing this legislation and making their communities more aware of the dangers of SUDEP. To date, many municipalities including Independence, Cleveland, Avon and Brookpark have passed legislation proclaiming October 25th as SUDEP Awareness Day.

Council President Schutt stated, at last count, 20 communities within Northeast Ohio are acknowledging this. Any other discussion?
